

Lesson Eleven

"Discovering My Spiritual Gifts - Two"

Objective: To discover our own spiritual gifts and provide a Scriptural understanding of these gifts and ministries set in the Body of Christ in order to have a productive and effective church.

The gift of faith may be defined as the special gift whereby the Spirit provides Christians with extraordinary confidence in God's promises, power, and presence so they can take heroic stands for the future of God's work in the church. The spiritual gift of faith is exhibited by one with a strong and unshakeable confidence in God, His Word, and His promises.

Examples of people with the gift of faith are those listed in Hebrews chapter 11. This chapter, often called "the hall of faith," describes those whose faith was extraordinary, enabling them to do extraordinary, superhuman things.

Rom 12:3 NKJV ...as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith.

The measure of faith you receive is in proportion to the calling on your life.

We all use our faith to walk with God, but the "gift of faith" goes beyond that. It is a spiritual gift or endowment given by the Holy Spirit for specific situations to help us be

victorious in seemingly impossible situations. God is glorified in these situations where through our faith He and we prevail!

<u>1 Cor 12:7-11</u> NIV Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. 8 To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, 9 <u>to another faith by the same Spirit</u>, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, 10 to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. 11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he gives them to each one, just as he determines.

As with all spiritual gifts, the gift of faith is given to some Christians who then use it to edify others in the body of Christ. Those with the gift of faith are an inspiration to their fellow believers, exhibiting a simple confidence in God that shows in all they say and do. Extraordinarily faithful people show a humble godliness and reliance on God's promises, often so much so that they are known to be quietly fearless and zealous.

So to sum it up, God gives all Christians saving faith. The spiritual **gift of faith** is given to some, who exhibit extraordinary amounts of faith in their Christian walk and who, by their faith, are a joy and an encouragement to others.

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The gift of music is the ability, talent and desire to make a significant contribution to a worship experience through singing or playing musical instruments.

Obviously, musical ability is a gift. Not everyone plays musical instruments or sings well. Usually a person with the gift of music will display an interest early in life and begin developing that gift. Some have the gift and just have not had an opportunity to use it. American Idol, X Factor and other shows are wildly popular because people love to see the discovery of incredible talent in action.

When a person discovers they have a gift to sing or play, that gift **must be developed** in order to be used together in a group of other skilled players and singers.

The first miraculous manifestation of the gift of tongues is described in Acts 2:1-8

To the amazement of the crowd in Jerusalem, the disciples were proclaiming the wonders of God in a language they had not learned. The gift of speaking in languages unknown to the speaker, whether earthly or heavenly is the outward sign that the Holy Spirit had now been given to believers, just as Jesus had promised.

John 14:16-18 NKJV And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever — 17 the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you.

Acts 1:4-8 NKJV And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," He said, "you have heard from Me; 5 for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

In the early church people became so zealous about these gifts that they lost the order and edification purpose of their meetings together. Paul's teaching to the early church help us to understand that we must use wisdom and order when operating in these gifts.

<u>1 Cor 14:12-13</u> NKJV Even so you, since you are zealous for spiritual gifts, let it be for the edification of the church that you seek to excel. 13 Therefore let him who speaks in a tongue pray that he may interpret.

1 Cor 14:14-19 NKJV For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my understanding is unfruitful. 15 What is the conclusion then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will also pray with the understanding. I will sing with the spirit, and I will also sing with the understanding. 16 Otherwise, if you bless with the spirit, how will he who occupies the place of the uninformed say "Amen" at your giving of thanks, since he does not understand what you say? 17 For you indeed give thanks well, but the other is not edified. 18 I thank my God I speak with tongues more than you all; 19 yet in the church I would rather speak five words with my understanding, that I may teach others also, than ten thousand words in a tongue.

1 Cor 14:39-40 NKJV Therefore, brethren, desire earnestly to prophesy, and do not forbid to speak with tongues. 40 Let all things be done decently and in order.

When God wants to speak to a group of people or an individual, you will feel an urging or a witness in your spirit to begin speaking. It is a spiritual gift but it involves your faith to operate in it. You will have to allow Him to use you. He will not force you. He is a gentleman. Often times, He will move on more than one person in a group setting but only one will obey. Then when the message from God in the unknown language has ceased, the same person or another person will feel the same urging or witness to flow with the interpretation. Sometimes you will understand everything said and other times, you will simply have a glimpse or an impression of the meaning and when you begin to flow with what you have by faith, God will give the interpretation literally as it comes out of your mouth with little or no thinking involved. It is wonderful and will always be to comfort, encourage, warn or benefit the hearers. God is not in the condemning business!

If you ever feel that God is moving on you to speak in tongues or interpret, please quietly ask permission from the person who is in charge of the meeting. Sometimes the permission needs to be asked through one of the staff pastors and they will relay the information to the person in charge. If the pastor has a witness of heart from the Holy Spirit also and it is in an orderly way and timing in the service, they will acknowledge you to begin. In most instances this gift would flow either during our prayer time or at the end of service. It would NEVER be appropriate for anyone to interrupt a sermon for the gift of tongues. God is already talking and He would NOT interrupt Himself!

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This gift is the ability to perform supernatural acts as an instrument or agent of God which alter the expected course of nature.

<u>1 Cor 12:7-11</u> NIV Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. 10 to another miraculous powers...11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he gives them to each one, just as he determines.

This gift is the ability to call on God to do supernatural acts that reveal His power. People with the gift of miracles see God show up in extraordinary ways, from daily little events to major public displays.

Biblical examples of the "gift of miracles" include:

You can use this gift in church or anywhere you are where there is a need for a miracle. Miracles are welcome here and we expect them!

Craftsman: One who creates or performs with skill; skill in making or designing.
